Data will be held securely on a password protected network and any paperwork stored in a locked filing cabinet in Stranmillis University College, accessible only to the research team. Full ethical approval has been granted by the Research and Scholarship Committee of Stranmillis University College.

At the end of the survey you will have an opportunity to provide your contact details only if you are willing to take part in follow-up group interviews. These interviews will be organised in locations across Northern Ireland during May/June 2019.
